


List [1 point each = 10 points]

Copy (yes, physically write) each word, its **part of speech**, the **definition**, and at least **TWO (2) antonyms** and **synonyms** in a notebook, on a vocabulary sheet, or on a note card

- example:
1. antagonize (v) to make hostile or unfriendly
synonyms: bother, irritate **antonyms:** charm, persuade
 2. chronology (n) the arrangement of events, dates, etc. in a certain order of occurrence
synonyms: order, arrangement **antonyms:** disorder, disarray



Sentences [3 points each sentence = 15 points]

Select any 5 vocabulary words from the list. For each word selected write a thoughtful sentence or sentences using the vocabulary word.

- each vocabulary word must be **used** correctly (part of speech) [.25 point]
- each vocabulary word must be **spelled** correctly [.5 point]
- each vocabulary word should be highlighted, circled, or somehow “**marked**” so that it stands out in the sentence for easy teacher viewing [.25 point]
- each sentence must have **context** for the vocabulary word **without using all or significant parts of the definition** [2 points].

*Remember, context is the hints that “give away” the meaning of the vocabulary word.

natty (adj) neatly or trimly smart in dress or appearance; spruce:

bad example: The **natty** man was interesting.

There is no context. I can replace the vocabulary word “natty” with the word old and the sentence is fine. Nothing in the sentence contradicts natty meaning old. A sentence with good context will provide good hints as to the meaning of the word—without using all or significant parts of the definition.

good example: The **natty** officer looked sharp. His uniform was spotless and freshly pressed; he was clothed to impress.

“[L]ooking sharp”, “uniform was spotless”, “freshly pressed”, and “clothed to impress” work together to provide excellent hints as to the meaning of “natty”. If I tried to insert “old” for natty the sentence just doesn’t make much sense.

EXAMPLE ASSIGNMENT:

Vocabulary #1 Assignment

Each paper should have a good title that quickly & easily describes the assignment

Your name should be on every paper

1. The **troglodyte** was nice.
2. I was **flummoxed** by the directions for the baby crib.
3. I was walking and talking with friends when I bumped into a light pole. As I sat rubbing my head my friends cried, "**Ninny!**" because I had been so stupid as to walk right into a stationary object.

abbreviations for any deduction/s of points

points earned for the usage of the vocabulary word

Key for understanding the abbreviations I use when scoring your assignment

C = no context or used the definition (-2)

C = mostly incorrect or used a significant part of the definition (-1.5)

C = partially incorrect or used a meaningful part of the definition (-1)

C = something small missing from the hint/s (-.5)

S = spelling incorrect (-.5)

U = usage incorrect (-.25)

M = vocabulary word not marked (-.25)
